

CAHABA LILY WEEKENDS AT LIVING RIVER

Discover the beauty and natural wonders of the Cahaba River during a weekend retreat of spiritual nourishment and deepened faith at the first Living River camp. Join the company of youth and adults interested in learning about the fragile environment of the Cahaba River watershed while camping at Living River and exploring God's wonderful creation.

The staff of the Alabama Museum of Natural History will partner with representatives from the Presbytery of Sheppards & Lapsley to offer a unique opportunity to explore the ecology of the Cahaba River and provide a relaxing weekend for fellowship and reflection.



Explore the geology and biology of the river through faith-based experiences of guided discoveries and times for reflection and leisure. Activities include canoeing on the Cahaba to see the largest stand of Cahaba Lilies, exploring the flora and fauna of the river with biologists, and sharing in discussions with experts and naturalists.

The weekend retreats are a great opportunity for youth, adults and families to camp and explore the property at Living River, canoe the Cahaba, see the lilies, hike the trails, and just enjoy the wonder and beauty of God's creation. Participants must be age 14 or older, unless accompanied by an adult.
